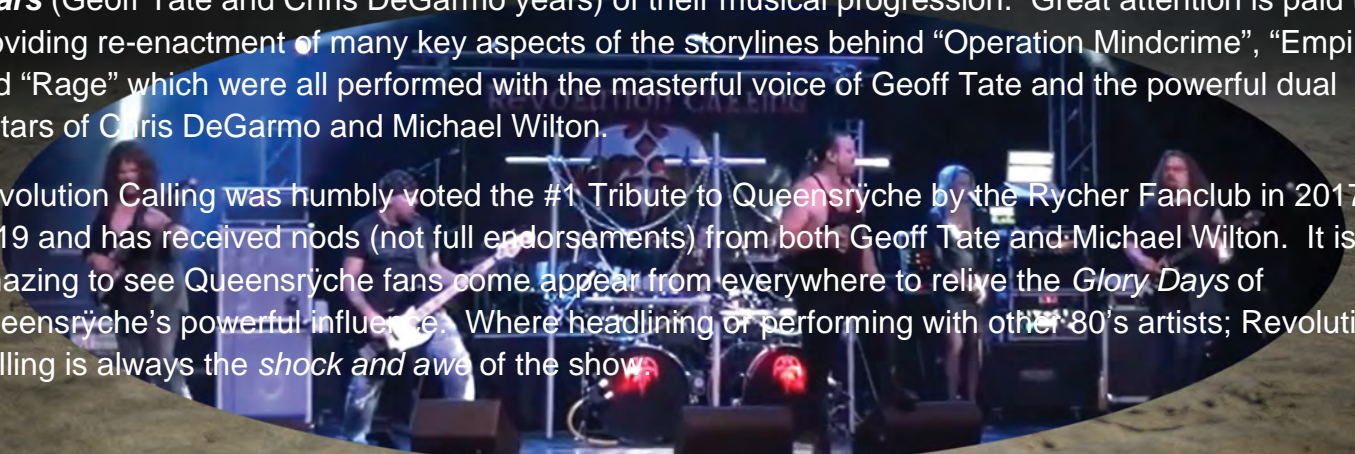
REVOLUTION CALLING

Olly Oliver (Scott Rockenfield)

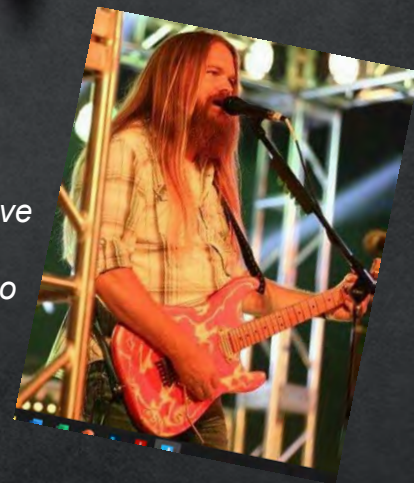
Drummer
